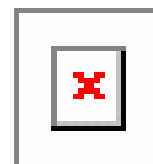



**MEMORANDUM FOR COOPERATION BETWEEN THE MINISTRY OF  
AGRICULTURE, FORESTRY AND FISHERIES OF JAPAN AND THE MINISTRY  
OF TRADE, INDUSTRY AND FISHERIES OF NORWAY RELATING TO CATCH  
CERTIFICATES**

In order to confirm their readiness to cooperate in the combat against illegal, unregulated and unreported (IUU) fishing, to secure continued responsible fisheries and to ensure the long term conservation of living marine resources, the Ministry of Agriculture, Forestry and Fisheries of Japan and the Ministry of Trade, Industry and Fisheries of Norway (hereinafter referred to as both sides) confirm the cooperation as described below.

1. Norway will issue catch certificates for crab products based on the Norwegian system of sales notes, which is an electronic traceability system under the control of the Norwegian authorities concerning fish products of Norwegian origin, exported to Japan. Catch certificates will be validated and submitted by electronic means. A specimen of the Norwegian catch certificate is attached hereto, and will be issued in English.
2. The cooperation concerning the issuing of catch certificates is limited to fresh, chilled and frozen products of crab, and covers king crab (*Paralithodes spp.*), snow crab (*Chionocetes spp.*) and hairy crab (*Eriocheir spp.*). Dried, salted, prepared or crab products in brine are not covered by this Memorandum.
3. Both sides decide to develop mutual assistance in order to facilitate the exchange of information and administrative cooperation between respective competent authorities. This includes procedures for the verification of the catch certificates issued.
4. Both sides will meet upon request by either side to address any issue relating to the functioning of this Memorandum. If either side intends to introduce or modify measures relevant to this Memorandum, it will inform the other side of its intentions and consult upon request.
5. This Memorandum may be modified upon request by either side. The cooperation will be initiated on the date of signatures.
